### FOREWORD

The Work Plan for the 2026 Artistic Gymnastics Senior-Junior Pan American Championship, which will be held from June 17 to 21 in Rio de Janeiro/Brazil, has been developed by the Pan American Gymnastics Union ("PAGU") and the Local Organizing Committee ("LOC").

The Senior Pan American Championship will serve as the qualifying event for the 54<sup>th</sup> WGYM Artistic Gymnastics World Championship in Rotterdam 2026 and the 20<sup>th</sup> Pan American Games Lima 2027.

## 2. GENERAL INFORMATION OF THE COUNTRY

**Official name:** Federative Republic of Brazil

**Area (Km):** 8,515,767 km<sup>2</sup>

**Coastline (km):** Approximately 7,491 km

**Capital:** Brasilia

**Location:** Brazil is a sovereign country in South America that occupies the eastern half of the subcontinent and extends to several islands in the Atlantic Ocean. Bathed by a long Atlantic coastline, it shares borders with almost every South American country: from Venezuela and the Guianas in the north, through Colombia, Peru, and Bolivia to the west, down to Paraguay, Argentina, and Uruguay in the south. Only Ecuador and Chile do not border Brazil, which reflects its vast territorial presence in the region.



Brazil is the largest economy in Latin America and the Southern Hemisphere, and it ranks among the world's biggest both in nominal GDP and in purchasing power parity. The country combines industry, large-scale agriculture, and abundant natural resources — oil, minerals, freshwater, and unique biodiversity — which strengthen its economic and strategic weight.

Despite its wealth, Brazil faces significant social inequality. Income concentration remains one of its greatest challenges, with a substantial share of national income held by a small minority. This duality — economic power and persistent inequality — is a defining aspect of Brazil's complex reality.

Brazil is considered a regional power and a key player in South America. Its size, economy, and environmental role give it a strong voice on the global stage. Many analysts view it as an emerging power with the potential to occupy an even more prominent position in the future.

**Currency:** The official currency of Brazil is the real (BRL), in circulation since 1994 and issued by the Central Bank. Coins come in denominations of 5, 10, 25, and 50 centavos, as well as 1 real, and banknotes are available in 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, and 200 reais. Their designs feature emblematic animals and national symbols, reflecting the country's natural diversity.

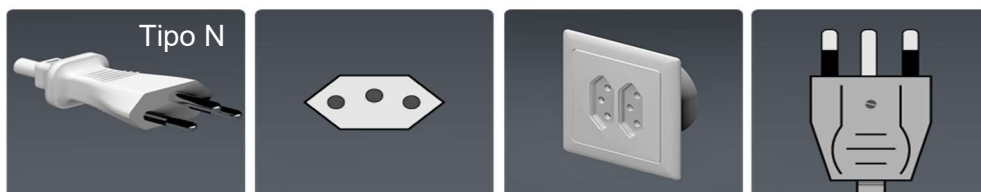


**Electricidad:** The voltage in Brazil varies between 110 V

and 220 V, with a frequency of 60 Hz. Power outlets use type N plugs, so an adapter may be necessary for some international devices.

The hotels and the Arena used by the organization operate on 220 V.

**Plugs and outlets:** Plugs and sockets are type N.



**Visa and Documents:** Travelers must present a valid passport, which **must not expire for at least 6 months after their first day in Brazil**. There are **no mandatory vaccines** to enter the country. However, for travelers coming from regions where **yellow fever** is endemic, it is **recommended to have a vaccination certificate**. **Check with your embassy to confirm whether a visa is required for entry into Brazil.**

**Tipping:** In Brazil, tipping is not mandatory, but it is a common practice in the service sector. In restaurants, cafés, and bars, a **10% service** charge is usually added automatically to the bill. Although optional, most customers pay it as recognition for good service. In hotels and other tourist services, it is also customary to leave small tips, although there is no fixed amount.

### About Rio de Janeiro:

Rio de Janeiro (often simply called Rio) is a Brazilian municipality and the capital of the state of the same name, located in the southeastern region of the country. Considered one of the most important international tourist destinations in Brazil, Latin America, and the Southern Hemisphere, it is also the most internationally recognized Brazilian city, serving as a true “mirror” or “portrait” of the nation.

It is the second-largest metropolis in Brazil (after São Paulo), the sixth largest in the Americas, and one of the most populated in the Southern Hemisphere. According to the most recent IBGE data, its estimated population in 2022 (published in 2023) is 6,211,423 inhabitants. It is known by the nickname “Marvelous City” (Cidade Maravilhosa), and those born there are called *cariocas*.



Rio is one of the country’s main economic, cultural, and financial centers, and it is internationally known for its iconic landscapes and cultural symbols, such as Sugarloaf Mountain, Corcovado Hill with the Christ the Redeemer statue, and the famous beaches of Copacabana, Ipanema, and Barra da Tijuca. Other highlights include Maracanã Stadium, Nilton Santos Stadium, the bohemian neighborhood of Lapa and its arches, the Municipal Theater, the Tijuca and Pedra Branca forests, Quinta da Boa Vista, the National Library, Paqueta Island, the New Year’s Eve celebrations in Copacabana, and the Rio Carnival, as well as its strong connection to bossa nova and samba.

Part of the city was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site on July 1, 2012.



**Climate:** In Rio de Janeiro, the host city of the event, the climate is predominantly tropical, with warm temperatures for most of the year. During the event period, temperatures typically range between 20°C and 28°C, with pleasant weather, lower humidity, and a low chance of rain. Summer (December–March) is hotter



and more humid, while the period between May and September is drier and more comfortable. Overall, Rio offers favorable conditions for outdoor activities throughout the year.

**Gastronomy:** Brazilian cuisine is diverse and reflects Indigenous, African, and European influences. In Rio de Janeiro, traditional dishes stand out, such as *feijoada* (made with black beans and assorted meats), *pão de queijo*, *moqueca* (a fish or seafood stew with coconut milk), and popular snacks like *pastéis* and *coxinhas*. Rio's beaches are also known for their classics: *açaí*, *tapiocas*, grilled cheese, and drinks such as coconut water and *caipirinha*, the country's most iconic cocktail. Additionally, the city has a modern culinary scene, with signature restaurants, international cuisine, and proposals that blend local ingredients with contemporary techniques.

### 3. GENERAL INFORMATION OF THE EVENT

#### 3.1 Participation

All Federations affiliated with PAGU that are in good standing with World Gymnastics and PAGU may register gymnasts for this Championship.

The participating Federations agree to comply with the Statutes and all FIG and PAGU Regulations, especially those regarding the license, age, and nationality of gymnasts and judges, as well as the rules concerning Insurance (Art. 11.6 of the FIG Technical Regulations), and in particular the COVID protocols established for this championship.

#### 3.2 Ages

##### Senior

WAG: 16 years or older as of December 31, 2026.

GAM: 18 years or older as of December 31, 2026.

(Gymnasts who have chosen to compete as juniors in 2026 may not participate in this event).

##### Junior

WAG: 14-15 years old as of December 31, 2026.

GAM: 15-18 years old as of December 31, 2026.

(Gymnasts who have chosen to compete as senior in 2026 may not to participate in this event).

#### 3.3 FIG License for gymnasts

All gymnasts must hold a valid FIG license through the end of the event.

Meals included in the room rate begin with dinner on the day of arrival and end with breakfast on the day of departure.

#### 4.3 Transportation

The LOC will provide transportation from the airport to the hotel on the official arrival date and from the hotel to the airport on the official departure date of the delegations (except for PAGU representatives).

The official arrival/departure airports are:

- Galeão International Airport (GIG)
- Santos Dumont Airport (SDU)

This service will be provided only to delegations staying at one of the official hotels and who book their accommodation through the Local Organizing Committee.

Upon exiting the baggage claim area, delegations must locate the Championship desk, where volunteers will accompany them to the designated transportation.

If delegations arrive or depart on a different date, the LOC may provide transportation at an additional cost of **USD \$40.00 per person per trip**. Please contact the LOC for these requests.

The Local Organizing Committee will provide transportation from the official hotels to the competition and training venues, and back, for all duly accredited delegation members, according to the official activity

schedule. The approximate travel time is **20 minutes** from the Hilton Barra Rio de Janeiro Hotel and **20 minutes** from the Venit Barra Hotel and **15 minutes** from the Marriott - Courtyard. Transportation schedules will be sent daily to the head of each delegation.

## 5. REGISTRATION AND INFORMATION OFFICE

Each Head of Delegation must go to the Registration office on June 13 at Arena Carioca 1, at the time indicated (to be communicated by June 10), following the process detailed below:

- **Station 1** - Only 2 person per Delegation may proceed to this station for the confirmation of names and FIG licenses, passport verification, and review of insurance policies/cards covering each member of the delegation.
- **Station 2** – Review of accommodation and meal reservations, and confirmation of return travel itineraries.
- **Station 3** – Payment of registration fees, confirmation of accommodation and meal payments, additional accreditations, transportation on non-official days, and the additional fee for those who did not book their accommodation through the Local Organizing Committee.
- **Station 4** – Receipt of flags, distribution of accreditations, and meal vouchers. If the required photo is not submitted as instructed, the LOC will take the photo upon arrival at an additional cost of **USD \$10.00 per photo**.

Participants must wear their accreditation to access local transportation services, competition and training venues, and all other official activities. Accreditation is personal, non-transferable, and mandatory for entry into training and competition areas.

In case of theft or loss of the accreditation, the LOC must be notified immediately so it can be cancelled. A replacement accreditation will cost **USD \$50.00**, to be covered by the holder or their Federation.

## 6. COMPETITION INFORMATION

### 6.1 Competition and training venues

#### Olympic Park – Arena Carioca 1 and 2

Av. Embaixador Abelardo Bueno, 3401 – Barra da Tijuca, Rio de Janeiro – RJ.

Two gymnasiums will be available:

- **Arena Carioca 1**, designated for competition (FOP)
- **Arena Carioca 2**, which will be used exclusively for training

Both venues will be equipped with FIG-certified **Spieth** apparatus for WAG and MAG.

The gymnasiums will be available for scheduled training sessions starting on **June 13**, according to the requests for WAG, and will be open for MAG.



### 6.2 Access to the Training and Competition Areas

Access to the competition and training areas will be restricted and only teams with an official scheduled activity may enter.



Judges will not be allowed to access the training area.

### 6.3 Trainings

The training schedule includes open and timed trainings, and all delegations must respect the assigned training times and locations.

The Organizing Committee assumes no responsibility if the assigned schedule is not respected. Delegations may request additional training time, and depending on availability, such requests may be approved.

The Senior Pan American Championship will serve as a qualifying event for the **54th WGYM Artistic Gymnastics World Championships in Rotterdam 2026** and for the **XX Pan American Games Lima 2027**

### 6.5 Competition format

**Junior** - 2 days of competition per discipline

June 18: WAG/MAG Qualifying Competition (Awards: All-Around and Teams)

June 20: WAG/MAG Apparatus Finals (Awards: Apparatus)

The competition format for Teams is 4-4-3.

**Senior** - 3 days of competition per discipline

June 17: WAG/MAG Qualifying Competition (Teams awards) (\*)

June 19: WAG/MAG Finals competitions (Awards: All-Around)

June 21: WAG/MAG Apparatus Finals (Awards: Apparatus)

The competition format for Teams is 5-4-3.

(\*) Qualification for the **54th WGYM Artistic Gymnastics World Championships in Rotterdam 2026** and for the **XX Pan American Games Lima 2027** will be based on the results of this competition.

#### 6.5.1 Group draw

The group draw for the qualifying competition was carried out previously and is at the end of this Work Plan.

#### 6.5.2 Qualification Competition

Each Federation with a team must submit the starting order of its gymnasts. In the case of individual gymnasts, in the first apparatus the countries will follow the drawn order, and in the next apparatus the gymnast who competed first will move to the end of that individual group, and so on. If a Federation has more than one gymnast, it may indicate the starting order among its gymnasts.

Even when a Federation participates with only one gymnast, it must submit the starting order to confirm the apparatus in which the gymnast will compete.

Likewise, all delegations must indicate whether their gymnasts will perform 1 or 2 vaults. It will not be possible to register 2 vaults after the deadline for the submission of the starting order.

The MAG mixed group will follow the attached order.

## 6.6 Results

Even though all gymnasts will appear in the All-Around and Apparatus Final results, only the **two best gymnasts per Federation** will be awarded according to the final ranking (see PAGU Technical Regulations).

To be eligible for a medal on Vault, gymnasts must perform **two vaults**, in accordance with the current FIG Rules.

Tie-breaking rules will be applied according to the **FIG Technical Regulations** and the **PAGU Technical Regulations**.

## 6.7 Awards

Immediately after each competition phase, the respective award ceremonies will be held.

Gymnasts and coaches are required to present themselves in the **team uniform** of their Country.

### All-Around Competition

The 8 best-ranked gymnasts will be invited to the awards podium (maximum 2 per Federation).

Gymnasts ranked 4th to 8th will stand side by side next to the 3rd-place gymnast.

Medals will be awarded to the gymnasts in **1st, 2nd and 3rd place**.

Gymnasts ranked 4th to 8th will be presented only.

### Team Finals

The 3 best-ranked teams will be invited to the awards podium. Medals will be awarded to the teams in **1st, 2nd and 3rd place**. Up to **6 gymnasts and 2 official coaches for Seniors**, and up to **5 gymnasts and 2 official coaches for Juniors**.

### Apparatus Finals

The 3 best-ranked gymnasts will be invited to the awards podium (maximum 2 per Federation). Medals will be awarded to the gymnasts in **1st, 2nd and 3rd place**.

**Note:** The diplomas certifying the places obtained will be delivered during the award ceremony.

## 6.9 Inquiries

Within the competition area, an inquiry table will be available where a review of the Difficulty score may be requested (FIG TR). The representative of the Federation must specify the reason for the inquiry and may not address any member of the Juries directly.

The Execution Jury scores are **not subject to appeal**. Inquiries must be submitted **in writing** and **immediately after** the score of the gymnast in question is published (FIG TR).

No verbal inquiries or inquiries regarding the Difficulty scores of gymnasts from other Federations will be permitted. Only coaches or accredited personnel who are in the Field of Play at that moment may submit an inquiry.

According to UPAG Rules, the cost of each inquiry that is not accepted will be **USD \$100.00**. When signing the inquiry request, the Federation commits to payment should the inquiry be denied. UPAG will send the invoice to the corresponding Federation; therefore, **no cash payments will be accepted during the event**.

## 9. INSURANCE

The Host Federation, the Local Organizing Committee, the PAGU and the WGYM will not be held responsible for any eventuality in the event of accidents, illnesses, repatriation or similar situations. The FIG Technical Rules stipulate that all participating Federations are responsible for making their own arrangements to obtain the necessary valid insurance coverage against illness, accidents and repatriation for all members of their Delegation.

The LOC will verify insurance upon the arrival of the delegation members (for example, a coverage note or a photocopy of the valid policy).

Accreditation will not be issued to individuals who do not comply with this requirement.

## 10. MEDICAL SERVICES

The Local Organizing Committee will provide first aid services at the competition and training venues during all official activities.

In case of an accident, the person will be transferred to Hospital Samaritano Barra (please check if your insurance is accepted by that institution).










